


#### A Prayer for Our School

#### St. Anthony History Part 3

The 1973 academic year began in a new building which was state of the art for its time, with one large open classroom. Educational ideas evolved, and the open room was partitioned into self-contained classrooms, with movable bookcases functioning as partial walls.

In 1992 the parish built a Family Center. The large meeting area became the cafeteria and gym for the school. An addition to the school, built in 1997, added four self-contained classrooms for students in grades five through eight, a science lab and a computer lab. Students in the upper grades moved from room to room within the addition, but all grades shared the computer lab.

In 2016, the school library, 3K and 4K classrooms and the Student Success area were all relocated into the open room. Grades 5K – Fourth were relocated to the self-contained classrooms. Our Seventh and Eighth Grade moved into classrooms in the Family Center. Students in Grades 5 – 8 were introduced to the Middle School Concept. Students begin the day in their home base and move to a different classroom/teacher for each of the core academics. St. Anthony School continues its tradition of faith, excellence and service.
