WALK-A-TH





Doing Easter Right — 50 Days of Joy

We spend forty days of Lent preparing for Easter, and then celebrate Easter as if it's a single day. But Easter isn't just a day, it's a season. It's not only a celebration, but an invitation to joy. In the Christian Calendar it is a season that lasts 50 days! In other words: the next 50 days should be celebrated as a *single joyful feast*. The celebration shouldn't temper down, rather it's only just begun.

We are heading into *Eastertide* (or Easter Season, or Easter Time or Paschaltide — all of them work!). This is a period of fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. It's a time to remember that Jesus wasn't in a rush to ascend, but that he spent time appearing to his disciples and preparing them for Pentecost. This is an extended time, then, to joyfully celebrate the resurrection. After all, the resurrection changes *everything*. St. Paul even writes, "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain, and your faith is in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:14).

Easter is a big deal. Consider what Pope John Paul II said, "Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people and hallelujah is our song."

St. Katharine is the patron saint of racial justice and philanthropists. Her feast day is celebrated on March 3. St. Katharine Drexel is the second American-born saint to be canonized by the Catholic Church.

Katharine Drexel was born in Philadelphia on November 26, 1858. Her mother died 5 weeks after her birth. For two years Katharine and her sister were cared for by their aunt and uncle. When her father remarried he brought his two daughters home. A third daughter, Louise, was born in 1863. The children grew up in a loving family atmosphere permeated by deep faith. Katharine was raised to believe that wealth was to be shared with those in need.

After her father's death, she established a religious congregation called the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Black and Native American peoples. Dedicating her life and fortune of \$20 million to this work.

In 1894, Mother Katharine took part in opening the first mission boarding school called St. Catherine's Indian School, in Santa Fe, New Mexico. Other schools quickly followed - for Native Americans west of the Mississippi River, and for the blacks in the southern part of the United States. In 1915, Katherine founded Xavier University in New Orleans, the first Catholic University in the United States for African-Americans

Katharine is remembered for her love of the Eucharist and a desire for unity of all peoples. She was courageous and took the initiative to address social inequality within minorities. She believed all should have access to a quality education and her selfless service, including the donation of her inheritance, helped many reach that goal.

St. Katharine was canonized on October 1, 2000, by Pope John Paul II.



April Virtue: Justice

Justice - being fair and giving each his due

To be just means to make sure every person receives what he or she needs, such as food, clothing, and shelter. This even includes obeying those in authority, playing games fairly, and respecting that which belongs to someone else. Being fair doesn't always mean giving each person exactly the same things - for instance, not everyone needs glasses to see well. But because we are all made in God's image and likeness, justice also means showing each person dignity and respect.
