

Lent.

a season of spiritual preparation

Lent, a period of forty-six days (forty when Sundays are excluded) that commemorates the time Jesus spent in the desert prior to beginning his public ministry as Messiah. Starting on Ash Wednesday and concluding on at sundown on Holy Thursday, it is a season when participants can carry out a three-fold mission, with the key pillars being fasting, almsgiving, and prayer.

As Jesus fasted in the desert for forty days, we, too, are called to forgo something for the same period when observing Lent. It should be noted, however, this personal sacrifice should be difficult but healthy, while respecting responsibilities.

Stressing the importance of recognizing those in need while demonstrating the model of selflessness that Jesus embodied on earth, Lent offers us an opportunity to further concentrate on displaying acts of charity within our communities by sharing time, talent or treasure.

Another avenue for self-growth during Lent that can lead to closer relationship with God is prayer. Lent presents us with an especially meaningful time to connect with our Lord and nurture our bond.

These practices serve to deepen our connection with God, our awareness of Jesus' sacrificial love, and to prepare our hearts and minds for the Paschal Mystery—the journey of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection. Lent is an invitation to reflect, repent, and renew one's commitment to living a life of faith, ultimately leading to the joyful celebration of Easter.
