To qualify as a Junior Scholar, students must score 550 or higher on the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing portion of the PSAT/NMSQT or 530 or higher on the Mathematics portion.

The program includes the offering of summer and weekend opportunities to these students in collaboration with colleges and universities and the SC Governor's School for Science and Mathematics. St. Anthony Catholic School is proud to have 3 students recognized as Junior Scholars.



December Virtue: Generosity

Generosity – giving without counting the cost

“Generosity is God-like. It means throwing open the doors of one’s heart and pouring out all our love on everyone. It means looking out for everyone else instead of looking out for ourselves. It means giving not only because we have extra or leftovers, but giving when there is a true cost to us - and expecting nothing in return. It means giving not only where we have a duty to give, but giving to the undeserving: to those we don’t like, or to those we do not know at all.” (Virtues in Practice)



Saint Nicholas was a kind man, known for his good deeds and selfless acts of charity. He helped families most in need and became the patron saint of children.

As bishop of Myra, Nicholas devoted himself to caring for the poor and defending children. At the Council of Nicea, he defended the divinity of Christ. To Roman officials who wanted to know who he was, he fearlessly declared: “I am Nicholas, a sinner, servant of God, and bishop of Myra.”

As a young man, Nicholas made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land so he could pray at the places Jesus lived. During the voyage, a fierce storm struck the ship. “Do not fear; God will protect us,” Nicholas told the sailors. Then he calmly prayed as the storm raged. Finally, the storm calmed down, but not before a sailor fell from the rigging. Nicholas prayed over the seemingly dead man, who miraculously arose as if he had only been asleep.

Another well-known story established the tradition of Saint Nicholas as a gift-giver. There was a wood-cutter who had three daughters. The poor woodcutter’s daughters had no dowry and were therefore going to be sold into slavery. However, mysteriously, on three different nights, a bag of gold was tossed through an open window landing in some stockings or shoes that were left by the fire to dry. Nicholas didn’t want the man to know. He knew that it’s best to help others without letting them know we’re helping them. If we help others in this way, we help because we truly want to and not because people will praise us for it.


When famine struck Myra in 312 and 313, Nicholas prayed to God for help. Soon he learned of several ships that had landed nearby, laden with grain destined for Egypt. He rushed to the port and begged the captain to sell some of the grain, promising the man that he would not get in trouble for the missing amount. Very reluctantly, the captain sold some of the grain. When the grain was unloaded in Egypt, true to the good bishop’s word, it weighed as much as when it had been loaded! Back in Myra. It was a miracle of sharing.

All of these stories tell us the same thing about St. Nicholas. He lived for God, which means that he lived for love. If people were in need and he was able to help, St. Nicholas gave them hope and strength. St. Nicholas never paused for a minute to wonder what he should receive in return for his help. He only thought about what he could give to those who needed him. This is why St. Nicholas is a good example of the virtue of generosity.

With the change in weather, just a few reminders about the dress code:

- Black, brown, or navy boots (not cowboy boots) are permitted **December through February**. (No sequins, lights, patterns, character logos, etc.)
