Participating students should bring soccer shoes, a ball to warm up with, and clothes appropriate for an outdoor day. Parents are encouraged to attend the event.



Given the name Guido at Baptism, this saint was born near Florence, at the end of the 14th century. He took up painting as a young boy. He joined the Dominicans at about age 20, taking the name Fra Giovanni (Brother John). After joining the Dominicans, he began illustrating manuscripts and choir books, beginning each new work with a prayer. Because of his faithfulness and the beauty of his art, people simply called him the Angelic Brother (in Italian, Fra Angelico). He also served in leadership positions within the Dominican Order.

Faithful to the promises he made as a Dominican, to preach the Gospel after having contemplated it in prayer, Fra Angelico put his creativity at the disposal of the Lord. With brush and paint in hand, he used his talents to transmit to all people the divine mysteries. Bl. Angelico spent a large portion of his career dedicated to projects within the monastery of San Marco. At the summons of the Vatican, he moved to Rome in 1445 where, over the next four years, he frescoed a number of chapels in the Vatican Palace.

Angelico was a tireless worker and finished a great number of paintings in his lifetime, but, thinking it would somehow be against God's will, he never retouched or reworked any of them. He always prayed when he painted, and he would say, "To paint the things of Christ, one must live with Christ." This saying can certainly be said to summarize Fra Angelico's life of Preaching though his art as a Dominican friar

Fra Angelico died on February 18, 1455, while visiting in Rome and was buried in the adjoining Basilica, where his body was covered by a simple slab on which was carved his portrait. The epitaph on his tomb reads: "When singing my praise, don't liken my talents to those of Apelles. Say, rather, that, in the name of Christ, I gave all I had to the poor. The deeds that count on Earth are not the ones that count in Heaven. I, Giovanni, am the flower of Tuscany." With a personality that was uncomplicated and clear, Brother Giovanni had lived a poor and humble life, refusing honors and positions.

Pope John Paul II beatified Fra Angelico on October 3, 1982. In a moving ceremony on October 18, 1984, the pope, on his knees in front of Fra Angelico's tomb, proclaimed him solemnly to be the universal patron of all artists. His Feast Day is February 18.

**Stewardship exemplified** - Famous for his devotional artwork Blessed John used his talents to praise God through paint. All talents can be used to praise God.


