Students in $5K - 8^{th}$ grades will continue testing this week. Please help your child be successful by:


- ensuring your child gets a good night sleep

He became a Doctor in Sacred studies and a priest. Knowing that robbers were coming to the church, against all risks, Saint Hyacinth removed Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and a statue of Mary from the church to a place that was safe. He did so to show his love and reverence for Jesus and Mary, but most of all he did so because of his faith.

October Virtue: Reverence

Reverence – showing your deepest respect for God and the things of God.


"When we have the virtue of **reverence**, we show in our words and actions that we have respect for anything that has to do with God - His Holy Name, the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints, the Holy Eucharist, and all the holy objects found in a church or that have been given a special blessing. We also show reverence for God when we show reverence for each other, because we are all made in His image and likeness." (*Virtues in Practice*)

The virtue of reverence ties directly to the concept of Respect for Human Life. October is known as Respect Life Month. Every October, we consider more deeply why every human life is valuable and reflect on how to build a culture that protects life from conception to natural death.

We teach children to love and serve others, but do we ever explain why? Service is not just something nice to do; it is an important piece of our Catholic identity. We believe that every human life is sacred because each person is created and loved by God. Therefore we are committed to upholding the dignity of every person, without distinction. This love of neighbor manifests itself in many different ways in our Catholic tradition.

Our relationship with God is the basis of our relationships with others. The Ten Commandments are not rules to avoid punishment; they are guides for preserving and strengthening our relationships. The first three commandments help us to grow in relationship with God; the last seven help us to grow in our relationships with others.

Within each of our relationships we practice virtues. The virtues direct our actions in a way that respects ourselves and others. If we follow the path of virtue, whenever we are faced with a decision or with a person in need, we will respond with love.
