

October Virtue: Reverence



St. Martha's story teaches us the importance of hospitality and generosity. She welcomed Jesus and his disciples into her home and served them with great love and devotion. She reminds us that true hospitality is not just about providing food and shelter, but about welcoming others into our lives and making them feel at home. She teaches us that true generosity is about giving of ourselves, not just our possessions.

St. Martha's example also reminds us of the importance of balance in our lives. In the story, she is contrasted with her sister Mary, who chose to sit at Jesus' feet and listen to his teachings, while Martha was busy with the preparations. This contrast reminds us that it's important to strike a balance between our duties and responsibilities and our spiritual life, not to be too busy to take time for God.

St. Martha's legacy also teaches us about faith and perseverance. In the story of her brother Lazarus' resurrection, she believed in Jesus' power to bring him back to life and her faith was rewarded. She teaches us that with faith and perseverance, we can overcome even the most difficult challenges and that with God, nothing is impossible.

Let us remember the example of this great saint and her dedication to hospitality, balance and faith. May we strive to follow her example, to be generous, to strike a balance between our duties and spiritual life, and to deepen our relationship with God through faith and perseverance.
