


# **Bear Blast**

# small change makes a BIG difference

We have a baby bottle for each House in the school library. Students are asked to bring loose change (or bills) to help fill the bottles. All money collected will go to Lighthouse Ministries Working Mothers Education and Support Program.

Lighthouse Ministries Working Mothers Education and Support Program is a six-month comprehensive program that provides low-income mothers with life skills classes, money management sessions and ensures that they have an adequate supply of diapers and wipes for their children.

Our Life Skills classes help these mothers by increasing their parental confidence and offering them positive, non-violent parenting tactics. We strive to improve parent-child relationships in an effort to reduce child behavior problems and alleviate parental stress and anxiety. The goal of this program is to prevent child abuse and neglect.

Additionally, our money management sessions focus on minimizing poor spending habits by developing and managing realistic personal budgets. We also provide each family with a six-month supply of diapers, wipes, baby lotion, baby wash, and laundry detergent for each of their small children.



The Feast of St. Francis is October 4. As has been our tradition, we will have a blessing of pets. You are invited to bring your pets to the front lawn of the church on Tuesday, October 4<sup>th</sup>, at 2:30 p.m.

Parents who intend to take students home from the blessing need to sign students out in the school office **by 2:00 p.m**. Students who have not been signed out need to return to the classroom for regular dismissal procedures.
