Dear St. Anthony Families,

MAP testing begins this week! But what is MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) testing all about? MAP Growth is a computer-adaptive test. That means every student gets a unique set of test questions based on responses to previous questions. The purpose of MAP Growth is to determine what the student knows and how they are growing academically. It is designed to measure student achievement in the moment and growth over time. St. Anthony students, grades 5K-eighth take the MAP test three times per year. However, it is important to remember this is not the only data we use to assess learning and drive instruction. MAP assessments, joined with other data points, provide detailed, actionable data about where each child is on his or her unique learning path.

Our Fall MAP testing window is open from September 18 through October 6. Homebase teachers will be communicating to parents when each class will be testing. Teachers will be discussing the data regarding your child's growth during Parent/Teacher conferences. We appreciate your efforts to ensure your child is present on those testing days. We will have make-up testing days scheduled if needed.

September 23 at the 5:00 pm Mass, St. Anthony School will be hosting the Parish Mass. Chorus will be singing, students will be lecturing, cantering, altar serving and ushering. Please let me know if your child would like to participate. Following Mass is our Spaghetti Dinner Night! This is our first family fun night of our year! 
A Familiar Face in a New Place

September 23rd is an opportunity for our students to share their gifts with our Parish Community. At the 5 PM Mass, students will serve as cantors, lectors, servers, and ushers. Students are not permitted to use cell phones or smart watches at school. These devices are a distraction and a temptation. If students need either device to communicate with parents after school, the device must remain in the student's backpack. Any call home during the school day should be made through the office.

Lighthouse Ministries Working Mothers Education and Support Program is a six-month comprehensive program that provides low-income mothers with life skills classes, money management sessions and ensures that they have an adequate supply of diapers and wipes for their children.

Our Life Skills classes help these mothers by increasing their parental confidence and offering them positive, non-violent parenting tactics. We strive to improve parent-child relationships in an effort to reduce child behavior problems and alleviate parental stress and anxiety. The goal of this program is to prevent child abuse and neglect.

Additionally, our money management sessions focus on minimizing poor spending habits by developing and managing realistic personal budgets. We also provide each family with a six-month supply of diapers, wipes, baby lotion, baby wash, and laundry detergent for each of their small children. September 18 - 22, 2023

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St. Padre Pio Feast Day: September 23

Francisco Forgione was born on May 25, 1887, in Pietrelcina, Italy. From his early childhood, it was evident that Francisco had a deep piety. When he was five years old, he solemnly consecrated himself to Jesus. From his tender age, Francisco had a peculiar ability. He could see guardian angels, spoke with Jesus and the Virgin Mary. This was not something taught to him, but occurred so naturally that he assumed other people could see them too.

At the age of 15, Francisco entered the novitiate of the Capuchin friars at Morcone. He took the name of "Pio" in honor of Pope Pius I, whose relic he often saw at his local chapel. Then on August 10, 1910, the much-anticipated day finally arrived. The twenty-three-year-old Fra Pio was ordained a priest

On September 20, 1918, Padre Pio received the stigmata while praying in a church. The wounds were on his hands, feet and side, corresponding to the wounds suffered by Jesus during his crucifixion. The wounds remained visible on his body for the rest of his life. At his death at the age of 81, all his wounds healed without scars, just as he had foretold they would 50 years prior.

Countless persons were attracted to his confessional and many more received his saintly counsel and spiritual guidance through correspondence. Padre Pio is mostly known for his deep wisdom about prayer and peace; his stigmata; miraculous reports of his bilocation; being physically attacked by the devil; and mastering the spiritual life. He famously advised, "Pray, hope and don't worry."

For Padre Pio, faith was life: he willed everything and did everything in the light of faith. He was assiduously devoted to prayer. He passed the day and a large part of the night in conversation with God. He would say: "In books we seek God, in prayer we find him. Prayer is the key which opens God's heart." Faith led him always to accept God's mysterious will.

Padre Pio died on September 23, 1968. Pope John Paul II recognized Padre Pio as a saint on June 16, 2002.
