
A Prayer for our Reconciliation Candidates

February Virtue: Honesty

Honesty - being trustworthy and true to our faith

Our virtue this month is Honesty. Honesty is more than just telling the truth. To be honest and trustworthy is also to live the truth. When we live honestly, our values are easy for all to see. We say words to help and heal rather than those that inflict pain or embarrassment.

As we talk about the virtue of honesty this month, we continue to challenge our students to be honest in their words and deeds. To live this virtue of honesty as Jesus did means to use our truth-telling in kind and life-giving ways. We work hard to take responsibility when our words and actions hurt others--even if they were not done intentionally. We live this virtue when our words match our actions, and our lives reflect God's love for us.



This month, we see examples of honesty in the face of persecution in the lives of Saints Jacinta Marto (1910-1920) and Francesco Marto (1908-1919) of Fatima. The Marto children were brother and sister. Their job, along with their cousin Lucia dos Santos was to care for the sheep.

On May 13, 1917, they were tending sheep with their cousin, Lucia Santos, when they received the first of six visions of Mary. Francisco was 9 years old, and Jacinta was 7, at the time of the apparition. The Blessed Virgin Mary asked them to pray the Rosary, to return to the Cova every 13th of the month until October and to accept any sufferings God sent in reparation for sin and for the conversion of sinners.

The people where they lived tried to say the children were lying about seeing the Blessed Mother, and they even put the children in jail. Despite being afraid and alone, the children did not give up because they were telling the truth. They prayed the rosary in prison, and all the other prisoners soon prayed with them. The children refused to deny what they had seen, and after they were released from jail, they had other visions of the Blessed Mother asking them to pray the rosary for world peace and for sinners.
